Plainview Public Schools Board of Education Meeting Monday, May 8, 2023

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Education of District 5 of Plainview, NE, was preceded by a Special Hearing on Amendment to the 2022-2023 School Budget in the secondary media center on Monday, May 8, 2023. The rules for open meetings were posted at the back of the room.

BUDGET PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing to present an amendment to the 2022-2023 budget was called to order at 5:17 p.m. by Tim Rasmussen, president. Sauser moved, Anderson seconded to declare an open meeting. Upon roll call vote, the ayes were unanimous. Motion carried. Roll call was answered by Rasmussen, Wyatt Frahm, Mike Sauser, Deb Jensen, Melissa Doerr, and Chance Anderson. Anderson moved, Jensen seconded to approve the agenda. Upon roll call vote, the ayes were unanimous. Motion carried.

Dr. Arlt presented the amendment to the 2022-2023 budget. The Activities budgeted expenses will increase from \$200,000.00 to \$225,000.00. A patron asked how much will be transferred from the general fund to cover the budget deficit and what caused the account to be over budget. Another patron asked what account in the general fund will cover the expense. At 5:30 p.m. the Budget Public Hearing adjourned.

Anderson moved, Doerr seconded to approve the agenda. Upon roll call vote, the ayes were unanimous. Motion carried.

CONSENT ITEMS

Consent items included the minutes of the April 10, 2023 regular meeting, the financial reports, and the May claims. The financial report (with last month's figures in parentheses) showed a balance of \$598,165.21 (\$570,184.95) in the General Fund. CDs total \$600,000.00 (600,000.00), Special Building Fund \$77,862.40 (\$37,198.95), Petty Cash \$2,531.22 (\$2,540.66), Activity Account \$54,160.31 (\$68,871.78), Nutrition Account \$62,193.67 (\$65,436.35), Employee Benefit Fund \$52,774.08 (\$52,713.83), Depreciation Fund \$56,569.33 (\$56,504.74), Payroll Account \$6,435.37 (\$6,005.96), Custodial/Section 125 Account \$13,888.63 (\$15,503.30). Total assets were \$1,423,840.88 compared to \$1,342,458.72 a month ago, and \$2,062,332.82 a year ago. April receipts totaled \$523,103.41 compared to \$228,598.77 in March. Disbursements totaled \$495,123.15 including \$132,501.80 for claims and \$362,621.35 for payroll. Building Fund receipts totaled \$40,663.45. There were no Building Fund expenditures. Claims to the General Fund totaled \$100,739.34. Sauser

moved, Anderson seconded, to approve the consent items. Upon roll call vote, the ayes were unanimous. Motion carried.
